Journaling exercise



In episode 3, Siphon and Grandad visit a local archive to learn more about Helen Caddick, a travel writer and photographer from the Victorian era. Miss Caddick had a long term interest in education, travel and anthropology. She travelled around the world between 1889 and 1914.

She visited Myanmar, the Philippines, South Africa, Uganda, Congo, USA, Mexico, the Caribbean, New Zealand, Panama, Peru, Argentina, Palestine, Egypt, Japan, Canada, India, Java, Australia, Cambodia, China and Korea. During her travels she collected cultural artefacts, took photographs and journaled her thoughts, experiences and observations. **Do you remember why Helen Caddick diaries are important today?**

Her accounts are primary sources that historians or storytellers can use to know more about the most heightened era of imperialism. Photographs, autobiographies and diary entries like Helen Caddick's are all examples of primary sources. Historians or storytellers can use these resources to learn more about certain eras. For example Helen Caddick's accounts give insight into the heightened era of imperialism.

You will be writing a journal entry detailing one of your favourite book or movie characters, don't forget to date it. Your writings will give future researchers knowledge of the Carolean age (today's era), so be as detailed as you can.
